



**Job Title:** SRAS Community Educator

**Reports To:** Education Director

**Position Summary:** A Community Educator facilitates learning of the Clarity's Sexual Risk Avoidance (SRA) / *Decide for Me* curriculum in public schools across south central Indiana.

**Who We Are:** Clarity of South Central Indiana has been a community treasure and resource for nearly 40 years. The purpose of Clarity is to create awareness about holistic sexual health and provide a path to healing for those affected by sexually-related traumas. At Clarity, we believe in possibilities. We look at our communities and see people full of potential; individuals whose life paths abound with possibilities. Our aim is to help individuals experience greater independence, build upon a healthy foundation, and realize the value of each aspect of their lives. We do this by providing women, children, men and families support and healing services through education, restoration and individual client services. Clarity is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization.

**The ideal candidate will:**

- Hold a Bachelor's degree in health or education field or experience in teaching/leading youth and/or public speaking
- Have proficient public speaking and interpersonal communication skills
- Possess computer competence and willingness to become proficient in presentation software
- Be self-motivated, dependable and able to carry out responsibilities with little supervision
- Agree without reservation to Clarity's Statement of Principle

**Responsibilities:**

1. General

- Establish a working knowledge of all Clarity programs and services.
- Complete Sexual Risk Avoidance Specialist (SRAS) training and certification.
- Maintain SRAS certification every two years.
- Stay current on sexual health issues, standards and current events to be effective in communicating to both students and parents. This includes reading books, articles, and doing research, etc.
- Report to the Education Director regularly through weekly memos, conversations, monthly reporting.
- Become familiar with Clarity's Federal grant goals, objectives and activities needed to meet program goals and objectives.
- Attend webinars and trainings when appropriate.
- Accept and abide by Clarity policies and procedures as laid out in the Clarity Staff handbook.

## 2. Teaching Duties

- Teach with fidelity the *I Decide for Me* curriculum as scheduled in public and private schools or other venues.
- Establish and maintain an ongoing working relationship with teachers and administrators in the communities we serve.
- Be open to learning and growing in skills and abilities needed to successfully impact youth in the area of sexual health.

## 3. Administrative

- Submit weekly “Week Ahead Form” to the Education Director listing any praises or prayer concerns, plans for the week and any intended tasks to do or completed the previous week.
- Submit a monthly report of program activities to the Education Director.
- Attend monthly Clarity staff meetings; attend Education Dept. team meetings; annual board/staff retreat; write articles for the Clarity newsletter and blog entries as requested; promote programs on radio stations as requested; assist with and attend Clarity’s fundraising events as needed.
- Submit Data Form and Fidelity Monitoring Tool for each class presentation
- Perform other tasks to support the overall objectives of Clarity. These may include, but are not limited to presenting at Clarity volunteer trainings and in-service workshops as requested.

**Compensation:** Hourly Pay, Variable Hours Monday – Friday 4-5 hours per day (approx. 20 hours per week during the school year and less during the summer months)

The Community Educator will receive a yearly written and oral evaluation from the Education Director.
